Mayor Kind called the meeting to order at 7pm.

Motion by Kind to approve the agenda. Second by Cook. Motion passed 5-0 on a roll-call vote.

A. Truth in Taxation Public Hearing

Motion by Roy that the city council opens the Truth in Taxation public hearing. Second by Cook. Motion passed 5-0 on a roll-call vote.

Penne Holt, 5110 West Street, stated that she had a big tax increase for taxes in 2021.

Diane Paulus, 5125 West Street, stated that she also had a big tax increase for taxes in 2021.

Mayor Kind stated that the tax increases were likely the result of an increase in their property valuations. The time to appeal property valuations was in the spring, but there still is time to appeal in Tax Court.

Motion by Roy that the city council closes the Truth in Taxation public hearing. Second by Cook. Motion passed 5-0 on a roll-call vote.

Second by Conrad. Motion passed 5-0 on a roll-call vote.

Motion by Fletcher to authorize Cornerstone Industries, Cook, and Fletcher to act in a sewer emergency at their discretion. Second by Roy. Motion passed 5-0 on a roll-call vote.
