

**Summary:** The City Council has been discussing changes to the Chapter 11 language related to diseased trees. The initial plan was to broaden the City Forester's authority to deal with the emerald ash borer. After further discussion, the City Council decided to focus on protecting significant ash trees on public property vs requiring the city and property owners to remove diseased trees on public and private land. The original draft ordinance also included the removal of the requirement for tree contractors to be licensed in the city. The City Council removed this requirement a while ago and did not know that the requirement still existed in the section 1140.80 subd 14. At their April 7, 2021 meeting, the City Council asked the Planning Commission to consider the following amendment. The amendment was included on the May 12, 2021 Planning Commission agenda.

Greenwood ordinance code section 1140.80 Tree Preservation is amended to delete subd 14:

Subd. 14. Tree Contractor License Required. No person may conduct or offer commercial (service for hire) tree trimming or removal services in the city without first obtaining a tree contractor license. The license shall be issued on an annual basis and licensees must pay the fee and provide proof of insurance in the amounts set forth in chapter 5 of this code book. Summary: Staff has reviewed the subdivision regulations and determined there is no provision for allowing lot combinations (two lots). Section 600.07 currently regulates lot splits with City Council approval. In order to simplify the process, it is suggested that minor subdivisions and lot combinations be subject to administrative approval. The ordinance indicates that in order to qualify for minor subdivision, certain conditions must exist. Those provisions will not change with this amendment. Most cities allow such subdivision with an administrative approval. Hennepin County will require an owner request form for lot combinations, and for lot splits the owner request form and a certificate of survey. The City Council should consider the following amendment:

The Greenwood City Code, Chapter 6, Section 600.07. Simple Subdivision is to be amended as follows:

Section 600.07. Simple Subdivision. Minor Subdivisions.

## Subd. 1. Application. This section shall apply to the following applications:

- A. In the case of a request to divide a portion of a lot where the division is to permit the adding of a parcel of land to abutting lot so that no additional lots are created and both new lots conform to Zoning Ordinance lot size minimum standards.
- B. In the case of a request to combine two existing lots.
- C. In the case of a request to divide a lot from a larger tract of land and thereby creating no more than two lots, both of which conform to Zoning Ordinance lot size minimum standards. To qualify the parcel of land shall not have been part of a minor subdivision within the last five years.



**Re: Law Enforcement Legislative Proposals** 

Dear Senator Osmek and Representative Morrison,

There are a few points we would like you to consider when reviewing potential law enforcement legislation ...

- 1. Qualified immunity balances three important interests the need to hold public officials accountable when they exercise power irresponsibly, the ability to maintain and manage an effective law enforcement program, and the safety of the general public. If the legislature removes qualified immunity protections for police officers, we will lose the ability to manage an effective law enforcement program which will place the safety of the general public at risk. Note that qualified immunity deliberations outcomes do not favor the actions of the police nor the actions of the individual.
- 2. If the legislature prohibits officers from making traffic stops for expired license plate tabs, there would be no reason for anyone to pay the state to keep tabs current. Effective management based on equal treatment for expired plate tab stops would be warranted.
- 3. If the legislature restricts the use of non-lethal tools, then our officers will not have reasonable tools to protect the general public.

Interest in law enforcement careers and the applicant pool has declined dramatically over the past few years. In these difficult times, it is especially critical that we attract and retain the best officers to interface in a positive, caring, and professional manner to keep our communities safe, protect people, and protect properties.

We respectfully request that you oppose law enforcement legislation that removes qualified immunity, limits traffic stops, and restricts the use of non-lethal tools. The state's efforts would be better spent on supporting city-driven efforts to attract and train excellent law enforcement officers.
